### Thanksgiving Bags

Bags are provided to low-income families; due to HRBC by Sunday, November 11.

Include the following:

- \$10 gift card to Kroger or Aldi
- Canned Ham or Turkey
- Brown Gravy
- Box of Instant Stuffing or Instant Potatoes
- Flavored Rice
- Macaroni and Cheese
- Family sized sweet potatoes / yams
- Family sized can of Green Beans
- Family sized can of Corn
- Cream of Mushroom or Chicken Soup
- Can of Fried Onions
- Muffin Mix, Cornbread Mix
- Graham Cracker Pie Shell in Pan
- Large Box of Instant Pudding Mix for pie
- Apple Sauce



## Richmond Baptist Center Christmas Store

Early each December, the Richmond Baptist Center turn its facility into a Christmas store, allowing those who qualify in the community a chance to “shop” for Christmas gifts for their family.

How does the Christmas store work? Each family is charged a small amount—\$5.00 for each child – entitling the parent(s) to select toys and several pieces of clothing. All donations are placed in a neighborhood fuel assistance fund for the winter months. The store is a ministry to the whole person where relationships are of utmost importance. Parents retain their dignity as they carefully select gifts for which they have “paid” a price.

The Christmas Stores are in the need of the following gifts for children birth – 10 years, due to Huguenot Road by Sunday, December 2. All items must be new, with tags remaining attached. Do not wrap any gifts.

- Clothing (jeans, sweaters, sweatshirts, sleepwear, socks, underwear, coats, hats, and gloves)
- Games (the Christmas Store receives too many Candy Land and Chutes and Ladders each year)
- Toys (the Christmas store receives too many stuffed animals each year)
- Books
- Bicycles
- Helmets
